NERF QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE WHEN NEGOTIATING SPONSORED RESEARCH AGREEMENTS

General Assumptions:

- (1) Invention rights limited to patentable inventions conceived & first reduced to practice in the performance of the Scope of Work under the Agreement;
- (2) IP provision contains an appropriate election period and negotiation period that provides the sponsor with a time-limited period in which to notify the University of its election to negotiate a license and to complete the negotiation of the license;
- (3) License rights subject to the University's legal ability to do so, when appropriate (i.e., to address exclusive license, other license obligations, non-participating co-inventors, etc.);
- (4) Where indicated, consultation with the authorized Campus Licensing Office (CLO) is strongly recommended.
